RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants

Ingredients

250g	Sultanas	¼ teaspoon	Grated nutmeg
250g	Chopped raisins	½ teaspoon	Ground ginger
250g	Currants	½ teaspoon	Ground cloves
125g	Chopped mixed peel	250g	Soft brown sugar
90g	Chopped red glace cherries	250g	Butter
90g	Chopped blanched almonds	½ teaspoon	Lemon essence or finely grated lemon rind
⅓ cup	Sherry or brandy		
250g	Plain flour	½ teaspoon	Almond essence
60g	Self-raising flour	½ teaspoon	Vanilla essence
4 large	Eggs		

Here's what to do

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.

Cover and leave for at least one (1) hour but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices.

Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures.

Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a 200 mm square prepared tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, It is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 - 3 pieces, cherries into 4 - 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 - 4 pieces.

Winners at country shows will each receive a cash prize of \$25 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.

The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize, and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show where the winner will receive a cash prize.

Note: Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in a State Final.

FEATURE CAKE OF THE SHOW – MARBLE CAKE

The following recipe is to be used for entrants in Class 22

Ingredients

125g butter
125g sugar
375g self-raising flour
125g milk
2 eggs
2 tablespoons cocoa powder
1 teaspoon vanilla essence
½ teaspoon pink food colouring

Icing

90g butter
1 cup icing sugar
1½ tablespoon milk
½ teaspoon pink food colouring

Method

Cream butter and sugar together until fluffy.

Add eggs one at a time beating well.

Sift flour, add to mixture, with the milk and vanilla essence.

Divide mixture into three (3) equal parts, colouring one part with pink colouring, one part with the cocoa powder, and leaving the third part plain.

In a greased and lined 200 mm round cake tin, place a tablespoon full of each mixture next to each other until all three mixtures are used up. **Do not swirl colours into each other!**

Bake in a moderate oven (180°C) until cooked.

After cake is cooked, stand for 5 minutes before turning onto wire rack to cool.

Icing

Beat butter in a small bowl with electric mixer until white as possible.

Bea in sifted icing sugar and milk in two batches, adding pink food colouring.

Using a spatula, smooth icing over top oc cake only.

- **Entries close** at 5.00 pm on Friday, 16th April 2021
- **Preserves must be delivered** to the Pavilion by 5.00 pm Friday, 16th April 2021

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR PRESERVES

- No portion of a collection may compete as a single exhibit
- In a collection, jars should be uniform in size and shape.
- Exhibits in each class shall comprise one bottle, except in collections.
- Each bottle must have a class label attached.
- Only unbranded or painted screw top lids or Vacola self-seal lids to be used for judging.
- Jars used for jellies, jams, marmalades, chutney or relish should hold at least 250 g.
- Sauces should be in tall sauce bottles.
- Dehydrated foods may include small jars for herbs/spices.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- Late entries will not be accepted.
- Exhibits are not to be removed during the Show.
- Exhibits entered in a wrong class may be transferred at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- The Chief Steward has the right to accept or refuse any exhibit.
- The Chief Steward's decision regarding the removal of an exhibit or exhibitor from the Showground will be final.
- In all matters regarding exhibits and exhibitors in the Pavilion, the decision of the Chief Steward of the Pavilion is final.
- If there are only two entries in a class, second place will be awarded at the discretion of the Judge.
- Results of judging will not be available prior to the first day of the Show.
- Entries must be in marketable condition unless otherwise stated.
- All exhibits shall remain the property of the exhibitor.
- Permission is assumed to reproduce any exhibit for publicity purposes.
- Every care will be taken with exhibits but no responsibility will be accepted.
- **Preserve exhibits to be collected on Sunday 25th April 2021 (Anzac day) from 1.00 pm to 4.00 pm.**
- **Prize money not collected by Sunday 25th April 2021 will be forfeited to the Grafton Show.**

Tips for exhibitors

- Try not to enter exhibit hot i.e. do not make on morning of entering.
- Lids should fit perfectly on jar.
- Jars and lids to be clean and free of any manufacturers' labels.
- Labels on lids may be covered with white contact or equivalent.
- Jam setter should not be used.
- Keep exhibit true to Class.
- Place a small label on jar listing contents.
- Fill jars within 7mm of top
