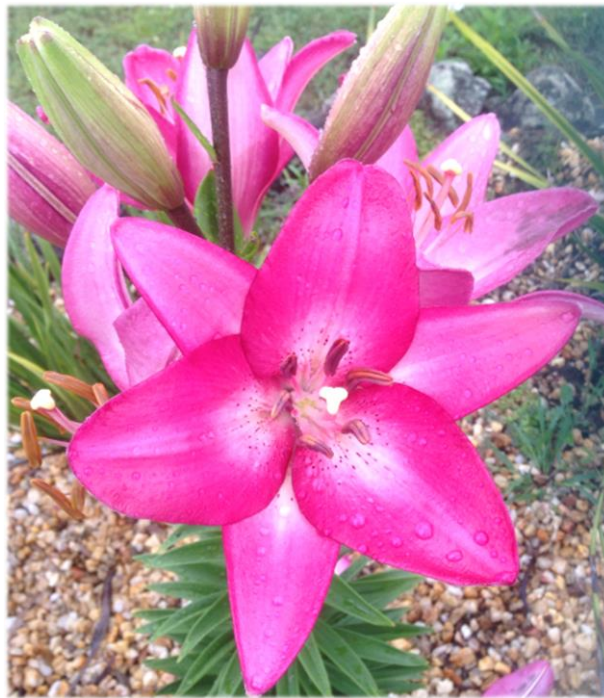

Delivery, Pick Up and Prizes

- Online Entries close Tuesday, 3rd May 2022, 6pm. <https://showday.online/show/grafton>
- Manual Entries and exhibit delivery Wednesday 4th May 2022 3pm - 6pm.
- Collect exhibits and prize money Sunday, 8th May 2022, 1pm - 4pm.
- \$1 entry fee for each exhibit.
- Prizes: \$2 first, \$1 second, ribbons for Champions.
- Uncollected prize money will be forfeited to the Grafton Show.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR POT PLANTS

- Pots must be manageable by one person.
- Pots must be clean and leaf litter free.
- Pots must sit on a saucer, with name and address underneath.
- Plants must be disease and pest free.
- Plants must be owned by exhibitor for at least six months.
- Plants are ineligible if they won a prize in the previous Grafton Show.

CUT FLOWERS

Delivery, Pick Up and Prizes

- Manual Entries Only for Cut Flowers.
- Entries and exhibit delivery 7am - 9:30am Thursday, 5th May 2022.
- Collect exhibits and prize money 1pm - 4pm Sunday, 8th May 2022. Please indicate if you do not wish to pick up your exhibit.
- \$1 entry fee for each exhibit.
- Prizes: \$2 first, \$1 second, ribbons for Champions.
- Uncollected prize money will be forfeited to the Grafton Show.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR CUT FLOWERS

- Flowers must be been grown by the exhibitor.
- Flowers must be free from pests, disease or other damage.
- Plants must be owned at least 90 days prior to exhibiting.
- One cut is one stem with bloom/s.
- Three cuts is three stems with their own bloom/s.
- Clear glass bottles and water will be provided by the stewards.
