### **GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR ALL ARTS & CRAFTS**

- Open classes are open to all ages, unless stated.
- Exhibits are not to be removed during the show.
- Exhibits entered in a wrong class may be transferred at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- The Chief Steward has the right to accept or refuse any exhibit.
- The Chief Steward's decision regarding the removal of an exhibit or exhibitor from the showground will be final.
- In all matters regarding exhibits and exhibitors in the Pavilion, the decision of the Chief Steward of the Pavilion is final.
- If there are only two entries in a class, second place will be awarded at the discretion of the Judge.
- Results of judging will not be available prior to the first day of the Show.
- Entries must be in marketable condition unless otherwise stated.
- All exhibits shall remain the property of the exhibitor.
- Permission is assumed to reproduce any exhibit for publicity purposes.
- Every care will be taken with exhibits but no responsibility will be accepted.
- Any exhibit not collected by Friday, 13th May 2022, will be disposed of.

### **CHIEF STEWARDS AWARD**

In each area in the pavilion the chief steward can present a special award, the Chief Steward Award. This is presented at the discretion of the chief steward, to an exhibit they feel deserved a prize but was not awarded one by the judge.

### **MOST SUCCESSFUL JUNIOR EXHIBITOR IN PAVILION BY POINT SCORE**

- 2023 annual trophy for the Most Successful Junior Exhibitor in the Pavilion - This will include all sections of the Pavilion, so if you enter a number of different sections, your placings from each of those sections will count towards the trophy. Points will be awarded as follows - 1st place = 2 points; 2nd place - 1 point. The winner will be the exhibitor with the highest total score.

- Exhibits must be delivered to the Pavilion from Tuesday, 18th April to Friday 21st April 2023 from 10am - 4pm. or on Saturday 22nd April, 2023, 9.00am to 11am. NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED

### SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR PATCHWORK, QUILTING & SEWING

- All exhibits must be unsoiled and not washed.
- All exhibits must have been completed by the exhibitor within the 2 years and not exhibited at a previous Grafton Show.
- Quilts must have three layers and have hanging sleeve sewn or pinned.
- Quilts that do not comply with the above conditions will not be judged.
- Classes are open to all Exhibitors except where stated.
- Definite: Novice - open to any Exhibitor who has been learning for the last 12 months and not won a prize at any Grafton Show.
- Ribbons and cards will be awarded for 1st and 2nd placings in each class. Sashes will be awarded Champion Exhibits where stated.
- All quilts measured and size attached on paper to assist volunteers for hanging, please.
- Patchwork, Quilting & Sewing exhibits to be collected on Sunday, 30th April 2023, between 10:00am and 4:00pm or Monday, 1st May 2023, between 9:30am and 11:00am.
- Prizemoney not collected by 11.00am Monday, 1st May 2023, will be forfeited to the Grafton Show.
- NB: Two entries per exhibitor per section maximum.

## QUILTED PATCHWORK COMPETITION

### Rules & Regulations

*\*This new competition is currently open to all shows and groups to adopt.*

*\*\*\* If group support is sufficient the RAS will be invited to conduct a State Final*

1. The exhibit needs to fit within a square (1m x 1m) maximum size
2. Framed and board mounted exhibits not permitted.
3. Must be machine pieced and machine quilted.
4. Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.
5. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
6. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final.
7. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level
8. If, for any reason, a winner is unable to compete at Group level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
9. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show.
10. An exhibit that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
11. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select a suitable quilt and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
12. Group Final location and date is to be determined by the Group. It is the responsibility of either the exhibitor or the Show Society to ensure the quilt is delivered on Judging Day and collected in an appropriate time frame after the competition.
