GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR ALL ARTS & CRAFTS

Open classes are open to all ages, unless stated. Exhibits are not to be removed during the show. Exhibits entered in a wrong class may be transferred at the discretion of the Chief Steward. The Chief Steward has the right to accept or refuse any exhibit. The Chief Stewards decision regarding the removal of an exhibit or exhibitor from the showground will be final. In all matters regarding exhibits and exhibitors in the Pavilion, the decision of the Chief Steward of the Pavilion is final. If there are only two entries in a class, second place will be awarded at the discretion of the judge. Results of judging will not be available prior to the first day of the Show. Entries must be in marketable condition unless otherwise stated. All exhibits shall remain the property of the exhibitor. Permission is assumed to reproduce any exhibit for publicity purposes. Every care will be taken with exhibits but no responsibility will be accepted. Any exhibit not collected by Friday 26th April 2024, will be disposed of.

CHIEF STEWARDS AWARD

In each area in the pavilion the chief steward can present a special award, the Chief Steward Award. This is presented at the discretion of the chief steward, to an exhibit they feel deserved a prize but was not awarded one by the judge.

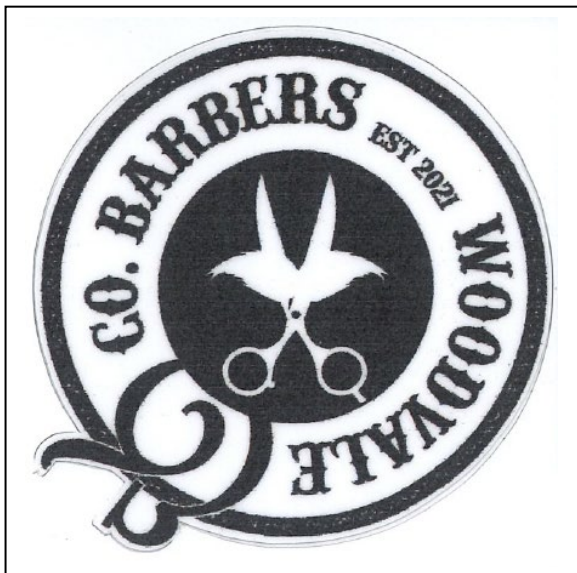

- Online Entries close Saturday 13th April 2024, 11.00am <https://showday.online/show/grafton> (use google chrome) or use the link from our website www.graftonshow.com.au
- Need help entering?? Fill out a manual entry form and bring it into the T J Ford Pavilion with your exhibit and our stewards will help you enter.
- Exhibits for Craft must be delivered to the stewards at the T J Ford Pavilion from Tuesday 9th April 2024 to Friday 12th April 2024, from 10am - 4pm or Saturday 13th April, 9 - 11am
- Entry fee \$2 per exhibit
- All exhibits and mountings must be unsoiled and in undamaged condition.
- All exhibits must have been completed by the exhibitor in the last 2 years and not exhibited at a previous Grafton Show.
- Porcelain dolls must not exceed 102cm in height.
- Craft exhibits are to be no longer/heavier than one person can carry.
- Framed exhibits must be presented ready for hanging.
- Classes are open to all exhibitors except where stated.
- No more than 2 entries per class, per person.
- Novice - open to any exhibitor who has been learning less than 12 months and not won a prize in any Grafton Show.
- Ribbons and cards will be awarded for 1st and 2nd placings. Champions and Supreme Champions will be awarded at the judges discretion.
- Collect exhibits Sunday 21st April 2024, 10am - 4pm or Monday 22nd April 2024 10.00am - 1.00pm.

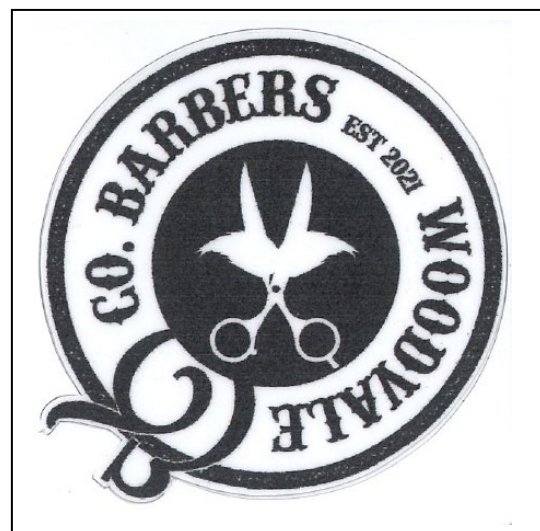
